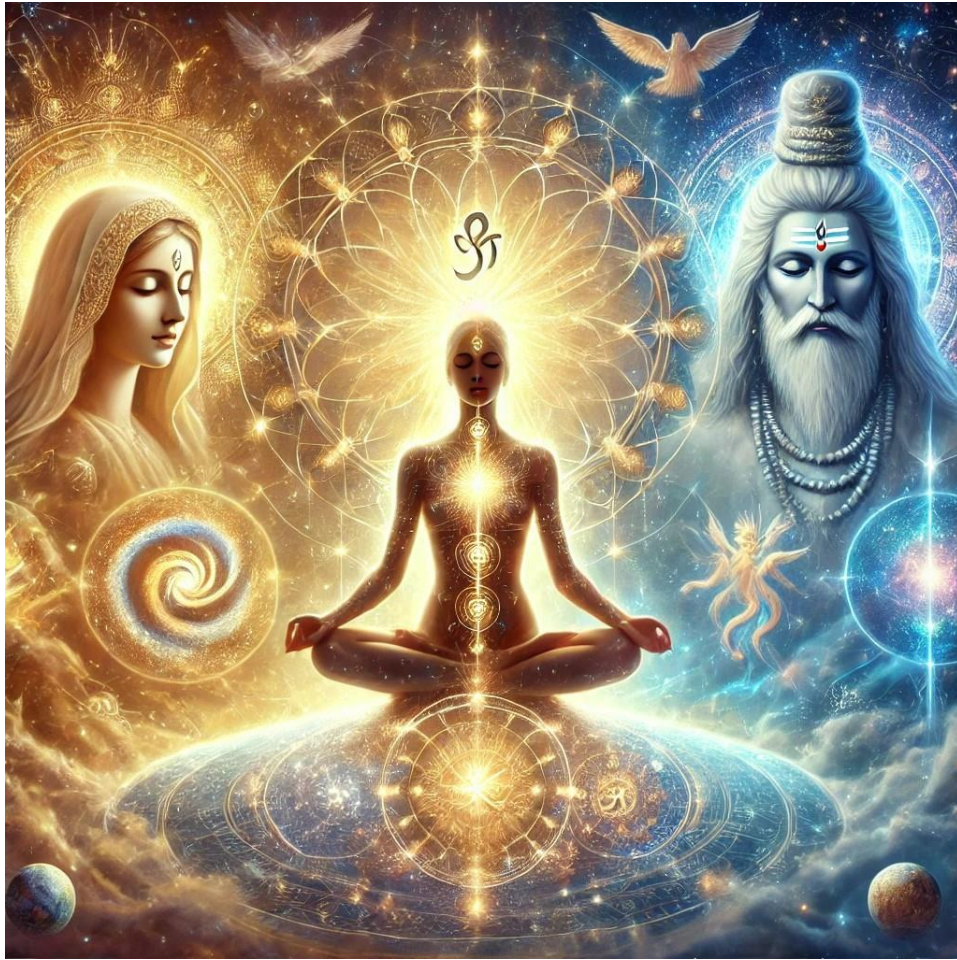


The Divine Feminine, embodied by Mary, and the Divine Masculine, represented by Shiva, within the Anunnaki realm of a world citizen.

Kukulkan's vision calls us to form a community that celebrates diversity and pursues collective spiritual growth, in a world that increasingly needs understanding and unity.

The Role of the Orthodox Church in Preserving Ancient Wisdom:

The Orthodox Church has played a significant role in preserving ancient wisdom and traditions. This includes the Oranta iconography, which has been passed down through generations. The church's emphasis on tradition and continuity has helped to keep these ancient teachings alive.

The Orthodox Tradition and the Eastern Orthodox Church:

The Orthodox tradition and the Eastern Orthodox Church is one of the oldest Christian traditions and forms one of the largest Christian denominations in the world. The Eastern Orthodox Church has approximately 220 million believers worldwide, making it the third-largest Christian denomination, after Roman Catholicism and Protestantism. It is a community of autocephalous (self-governing) churches, each with its own spiritual leader, such as patriarchs or archbishops. The Schism of 1054:

The Great Schism formally took place in 1054 when representatives of the Pope and the Patriarch of Constantinople mutually excommunicated each other. This officially split the churches.

The Eastern Orthodox Church is one of the oldest and largest Christian traditions, with roots in early Christianity and the Great Schism of 1054. The Orthodox tradition is particularly strong in Eastern Europe and the Middle East, with global communities formed through the diaspora.

Spread of the Orthodox Church:

The Orthodox tradition is primarily spread throughout Eastern Europe, the Balkans, and the Middle East, but also has communities in other parts of the world. Countries with a strong Orthodox presence include:

- **Russia:** The Russian Patriarchate is one of the largest within the Orthodox Church, with millions of followers.
- **Greece:** Greek Orthodoxy has deep historical and cultural roots, closely tied to Greek identity.
- **Serbia, Bulgaria, Romania, and Georgia:** These countries have their own autocephalous churches and a strong Orthodox tradition.

Oranta (The Praying Mother) and the Shiva-Shakti Dynamic:

In this image, Mary stands upright with Jesus as a "medallion" on her chest (known as the "Platytera" or "More Spacious Than the Heavens"). This image portrays Mary's

role as an intercessor and the connection between heaven and earth. Mary prays with raised hands for humanity, while Jesus in her center represents the divine presence on earth. This depiction is often seen in the domes and apses of Orthodox churches.

Oranta and the Shiva-Shakti Dynamic:

By comparing the Oranta icon to the Shiva-Shakti dynamic, a deeper spiritual parallel emerges that highlights the symbiosis between divine guidance and worldly manifestation. This comparison adds a rich symbolic layer to the representation, emphasizing universal themes like divine love and protection, and strengthens the connection between different spiritual traditions.

This vision can resonate with the quest for a deeper understanding of universal energy and the connection between divine forces in different religions. It could stimulate a discussion focused on transcending dogma, emphasizing the spiritual experience shared across various traditions.

The idea that Mary (Shiva) is the source of divine energy, and Jesus (Shakti) embodies this energy on earth, provides a powerful angle to reflect on how different religions perceive and manifest divine energy. By comparing Mary and Shiva, and Jesus and Shakti, an interreligious dialogue is encouraged.

Although there are dogmatic and cultural differences, there is a common striving to understand the divine energy that works both in heaven and on earth. Highlighting universal themes such as love, protection, and intercession can build a bridge between different spiritual paths. Kukulcan's vision could advocate for a broader, more inclusive approach to divine and spiritual knowledge.

The Filioque controversy, which led to the split between the Eastern and Western churches, is not only a matter of dogmatic differences but also a broader misunderstanding of the nature of divine energy. This theological twist can be linked to how other traditions (such as the vision of Shiva and Shakti) understand divine energies both in their origin and in their manifestation.

Visual Representation:

In the Oranta icon, we see Mary (Shiva) praying with Jesus (Shakti) as a medallion on her chest, symbolizes the divine spark within each individual. This image underscores the symbiosis between divine source and worldly expression, with Mary (Shiva) as the divine guiding force and Jesus (Shakti) as the human manifestation that is led and supported.



Mary as Divine Power (Shiva):

In this vision, Mary is the higher, cosmic power embodying divine energy, much like Shiva in the cosmic dance (Nataraja). She is the source of divine wisdom and light.

Comparison with Shiva and Shakti:

In this vision, the Oranta shows a strong resemblance to the Shiva-Shakti dynamic within the Hindu tradition:

- **Mary as Shiva:** Mary represents the divine source, akin to Shiva. She acts as the source of cosmic guidance and spiritual strength. Like Shiva, the cosmic dancer who creates and sustains the universe, Mary bridges the divine and the world.
- **Jesus as Shakti:** Jesus represents the worldly manifestation of the divine, similar to Shakti. He is the physical embodiment of Mary's divine energy and

wisdom on earth, just as Shakti is the dynamic force that brings Shiva's divine energy to the world.

In this interpretation, Mary represents the role of Shiva as divine power, while Jesus embodies the human form, just as Shakti is the worldly expression of cosmic energy.

Similarities and Symbolism

- **Cosmic Connection:** Just as Shiva and Shakti together create and sustain the universe, Mary as Shiva embodies the divine connection between heaven and earth, while Jesus as Shakti manifests this on earth.
- **Heaven and Earth:** Mary's prayer in the Oranta image forms a bridge between the heavenly and the earthly, a role similar to how Shiva and Shakti balance cosmic and worldly forces.
- **Divine Protection and Intercession:** Mary (Shiva) offers protection and guidance, while Jesus (Shakti) actively manifests this guidance on earth. Just as Nataraja sustains and protects the universe, Jesus as Shakti symbolizes divine care and salvation.
